### WHAT WE DO:

#### Teaching

- Promote policies which educate students, favour meritocracy and guarantee everyone's right to education.

- Enhance the quality of teaching by strengthening international partnerships in education.
- Provide students with the scientific, theoretical and practical foundation necessary for their chosen profession.

#### Research
